

Tin Foil Stained Glass


Age Range: All Ages


<u>Supplies:</u> Tin foil, paper plates, saran wrap, tape, permanent markers, circular coloring page template (about the same size as the paper plate).


<u>Set Up:</u> Tape the coloring page to a table, tape a piece of saran wrap over the coloring page being sure to cover the circular part of the coloring page. Using the foil, cover the paper plate. Make one foil covered paper plate per child.

<u>Instructions:</u> Using a dark colored permanent marker, have the children trace the outline of the coloring page on the saran wrap. Once the entire page is outlined have the children color the design. Once the entire design is colored, gently lift the colored saran wrap and place over the foil lined plate and tape in place. Note: be sure the children are coloring gently on the saran wrap as it may tear if colored on too hard.











Trim a Tree

<u>Supplies:</u> Craft sticks (6 regular size, one jumbo craft stick per child), glue, green & brown paint, sequins, pom poms and other craft supplies to decorate the tree.

<u>Set Up:</u> Cut the craft sticks into various sizes ranging from small to large, these sticks will resemble a Christmas tree shape. Each child will receive 7 popsicle sticks total.

<u>Instructions</u>: Give each child 1 jumbo stick and 6 precut craft sticks. Have the children glue the regular size precut sticks onto the large stick in the shape of a tree. Once glued down, they can paint their tree with the green and brown paint then sequins and pom poms to decorate the tree.





Spin-Art Dreidel & Dreidel Game

<u>Supplies:</u> CDs (1 per child), hot glue, markers (1 per child to keep), permanent marker, paper, glue gun and glue gun glue, small objects such as beads or even small wrapped pieces of candy.

<u>Set Up:</u> You will need to prep the CDs before this activity. Do this by placing a marker into the center hole of the CD with the top of the marker facing down. Hot glue the marker into place so the CD does not move.

<u>Instructions:</u> Give each child a permanent marker and have them split the CD into 4 equal parts with straight lines. In each section have them write the four different Hebrew letter, one per section (see photo below). Give each child a piece of paper, when they are ready, they can remove the cap of the marker and begin spinning their dreidel CD!







Dreidel Game

Supplies: Premade dreidels

<u>Instructions:</u> Give each child the same number of small objects. The children will take turns spinning their dreidels, (if the caps are off of the markers be sure to have a piece of paper under each marker). Once the spinning stops, depending on the letter the dreidel lands on will depend what the child does. Shin: Put one pieces into the middle. Hay: You win half of the pieces in the middle. Nun: Nothing Happens, next player spins. Gimmel: You win all the pieces in the pot. The child with the most points at the end wins!



Kwanza Placemat

Supplies: 5 Sheets of construction paper (black, red, yellow & green) per child, scissors, glue

<u>Set Up:</u> Take the black piece of paper and fold it in half, using the scissors cut 6-8 slices through the paper at the fold mark, not cutting all the way through. Unfold the paper. Using the red, yellow and green paper, cut strips about 1 inch wide.

<u>Instructions:</u> Give each child the back pre cut paper and several strips of the yellow, red and green strips. Have the children weave the strips over and under the black paper. Continue this until there is no more space for more strips. Use the glue to glue the ends of the strips to the black paper so the strips do not move.
